2007 Annual Report Figures

Florida Public Library

- chartered to serve 4,679 (2000 census)
- had 2,862 registered borrowers
- was open 54-59 hours per week
- had 94,582 total holdings, including 68,470+ in electronic materials
- circulated 29,800 items, including 8,924 children's materials
- borrowed 7,470 items from other libraries
- loaned 6,959 items to other libraries
- added 12,065 new items (9,800 electronic)
