The Library's annual budget vote and trustee election is Wednesday, April 3 from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. at the library. All qualified voters of the school district are eligible to vote and absentee ballot applications are available now. Our proposed budget is on page 2 and copies are available in the library. In addition to approval of our yearly funding, voters will elect three trustees for one one-year term and two three-year terms.

This fall, we will celebrate our 55th Anniversary and 13 years at Cohen Circle. The Library keeps growing as a vital community center. Our 2012 circulation of materials increased by 6.6% and we continue to loan more materials to other libraries than we borrow. Libraries are a great American value and we are here to serve you seven days a week and online anytime. We encourage you to vote and thank you for your strong support of your hometown library!


2012 Annual Report Figures

Storybook Art Studio for Kids

We are pleased to announce that FPL has been awarded a \$1,000 2013 Arts Community Grant from Arts in Orange. Our Storybook Art Studio will be a Visual Literacy series about Caldecott Award-winning picture books featuring art studio time with professional artist Heidi Bilezikian and a visit from author and illustrator Steve Light.

Storybook Art Studio is a six-week hands-on interactive art program for kids in grades K to 3 to:

- Explore visual literacy through art elements in picture book illustrations
- Listen to Caldecott Award-winning books as read by our librarians
- ♦ Create art in a variety of media

Week 1 ~ Author Illustrator Steve Light will appear at FPL on Tuesday, April 2 when he will read his newest book, Zephyr Takes Flight & share his sketches from idea to story to completed work. Book & art lovers of all ages are invited.

Weeks 2 - 5 ~ In the Studio Children will work with Heidi exploring different media used in picture book artwork and create their own project based on the techniques.

Week 6 ~ Storybook Art Studio Show open to family, friends and the public. Children's artwork from the previous weeks will be on display on Tuesday, May 7 from 4 to 8 p.m.

Teens in our community are also invited to participate in our grant using video cameras to record librarians reading stories, children working and talking about their artwork, and highlights of the art gallery at the end of the series.



This project is made possible, in part, with public funds from the New York State Council on the Arts' Decentralization Program administered by Arts in Orange.


