- Programs to resume the week of January 11<sup>th</sup>. Program Alert: Pie Night with Janet is Jan. 28<sup>th</sup>!
- O&R and RCLS are introducing “HomeBoost – A Do-It-Yourself Home Energy Assessment Program.” This program provides local libraries with a HomeBoost kit which patrons can check out. The kit has a Thermal Imaging Camera that will allow customers to perform a DIY Home Energy Assessment. It comes with everything they need to check their home’s efficiency, plus step-by-step help from the HomeBoost app. After the customer performs the assessment, they will get a FREE custom energy report by email, a \$99 value, courtesy of O&R. We have received our kit and I am planning to have O&R give a demo for the staff. We would add this item to our Library of Things.
- Dawn recently applied for the “Let’s Go Compost” program and I am pleased to report that we have been awarded a STEM Worm Farm! Dawn and Beth will be doing some composting program which will tie in wonderfully with the summer reading theme of “Unearth a Story.”
